Other Important Information:

New As of 1/10/2022

- At the December 20, 2021 School Board meeting the Mason School Board gave the superintendent permission to make adjustments to the Return to Learning Plan as needed in emergency situations or as new information was provided from NH DHHS.
- Different cohorts of students could be in different phases of the plan ex) Red and Green phase
- Mask breaks will be provided when students are distanced 6 feet, when eating, and when outside. In most classrooms there is 6 feet of distance so masks can be taken off when students are seated at their desks.
- A well fitting mask is key to returning to school after 5 days. If a well fitting mask is not able to be worn then the students or staff member will not be allowed to return until the full isolation/quarantine has been completed. A 3ply well fitting surgical mask is preferred/suggested for post isolation/quarantine periods. The school is able to provide surgical masks for those students/staff that need them.
- Testing negative on an antigen test is necessary before returning from reduced isolation. Rapid antigen tests are available at the school but at home tests will also be accepted.
