JICDD – STUDENT DISCIPLINE: OUT OF SCHOOL ACTIONS

Category R See Also JIA & JIC

The Board recognizes that out-of-school and off-campus student conduct is not normally the concern of the Board. However, the Board also recognizes that some out-of-school and off-campus conduct may have adverse effect upon the school, school property, or school staff. Therefore, it shall be the policy of this Board that the Board or school administrators may impose disciplinary measures against students for certain out-of-school or off-campus conduct.

Discipline, including but not limited to, suspension or expulsion, may be imposed if, in Principal's opinion such off-campus or out-of-school conduct causes, or is likely to cause, a significant disruption of the orderly operation of the school, or substantial interference with the school's educational mission, purpose or objective.

Out-of-school and off-campus student conduct that may subject a student to discipline includes, but is not limited to:

- 1. Damaging school property;
- 2. Violence at or near the school's bus stop, either before or after the school day;
- 3. Drinking alcohol, using tobacco products, or using illegal drugs or controlled substances, at or near the school bus stop, either before or after the school day;
- 4. Damaging the private property of students, school staff, or employees;
- 5. Engaging in activity which causes or threatens physical or emotional harm to other students, teachers, or other school personnel;
- 6. Engaging in activity that directly impedes discipline at school, or the general welfare of school activities or school operations;
- 7. Bullying, cyberbullying, and/or internet threats, whether on or off school grounds, in accord with Policy JICK;
- 8. Selling or distributing illegal drugs or controlled substances or;
- 9. Any other activity the Board or administration determines violates this policy.

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
